## Sunrise celebrates 40th anniversary

Back in 1982 when Ann Caine and her daughter Nicola started Sunrise, neither had any idea of just what they were starting. Using the facilities at Circle C Ranch in Puslinch, "We had five riders with cognitive disabilities, a borrowed horse and two ponies" confesses Ann. Nicola ran the part time program for 15 years which later became a full time-year round program.

From those humble beginnings, Sunrise would move four times before the farm, where it is now located, was purchased in 1996. Since then they have served hundreds of adults and children.

"We have up to 145 riders a week from September to June, including six schools that bring students from special education classes." shares Ann. During the summer months, Farm Discovery Camps and Riding Camps are offered, with up to 50 campers on site every week day, and around half are campers with disabilities.

Ann was on the board since its inception and then joined staff in 1996 as Executive Director, and on her retirement in 2015, returned as President of the Board. Today there is an executive director, six full time instructors, and a part time maintenance co-ordinator. There are usually 35 leaders in training each summer, and close to 300 volunteers support the programs year-round.

On average 3,368 hours of riding lessons are delivered annually, as well as on-ground grooming sessions, Equine Assisted Learning (EAL) sessions which focus on team building, lowering anxiety and mental/emotional well being. A life skills program for school graduates with disabilities is also offered.

While the majority of the participants come from Wellington County, the program draws clients from across South Western Ontario. "Children and adults are referred by their family doctor," explains Ann. The children are assessed and come with a wide range of special needs – cognitive, FASD, high anxiety, ADHD, Downs Syndrome, Autism, as well as physical disabilities such as Cerebral Palsy, head injury, and many other diagnoses.

Most parents want their children to make friends and experience

being socially accepted because children with disabilities experience a great deal of isolation and alienation. But at Sunrise everyone is valued and accepted.

"It is wonderful to see the impact our program can have on children." reports Ann. For example, one three year old girl who couldn't crawl or walk and when she was first put on a horse she just lay forward and had to be carried from place to place. Fast forward to today, and she can now sit upright on the horse, uses a walker on her own and can now stand and sit without assistance.

"To sit on a 1,000 pound horse and feel in control, maybe for the first time in their lives, is a transforming moment. It's my passion to have the privilege of working with such a wonderful community of people from whom I have learned so much – and continue to do so "

Throughout the year, the 40th Anniversary will be celebrated and Sunrise will launch the quiet phase of a capital campaign to build residential facilities, meeting a much-needed gap in service for people with disabilities.

#### **Council Clips**

#### Clair-Maltby Secondary Plan:

Guelph City responds to Council's concerns around traffic, road network, urban-rural transition area, hydrogeology and building heights of the Clair-Maltby urban expansion area.

## Wellington Road Master Action Plan Approved:

Provides a long- term plan for County roads and identifies the transportation network improvements required to accommodate the County's population and employment growth over the next 20 years.

Council requests socioeconomic factors and quality of life of residents be included in their vision statement.

#### Social Media Program:

The Township has launched its corporate Facebook and Twitter pages, providing another way for the Township to deliver timely information to the public.

## "Road Diet" Design Through Aberfovle:

Council hesitant on County's proposed "road diet" being the conversion of the existing four lane cross section.

It consists of the two travel lanes in each direction between Wellington Road 34 and Gilmour Road, merging into a single travel lane in each direction with a two- way centre left turn lane and a parking lane.

#### **County Growth Structure:**

Wellington County proposed official plan amendment, includes identification of a new economic development study area and identification of the historic hamlet of Puslinch.

#### **Township Budget:**

Council considers its budget with a Township tax increase of 3.83% with a blended tax increase of 2.03%.

This amounts to another \$19 per \$100,000 of assessment. Four % cost of living increase for staff was approved.

Allocation of \$5,000 to facilitate inspection of community centre roof prior to proceeding with replacement of ceiling tiles.

#### **High Speed Internet:**

Council authorized letters to our local MP and MPP requesting their support in expressing the Township's frustration to the Ministry of Rural Economic Development over their delay in announcing the approval of Universal Broadband Fund projects.

#### Aggregate Resources Act:

The Ministry of Northern Development, Mines, Natural Resources & Forestry is proposing regulatory changes under the Aggregate Resources Act to harmonize with new provincial requirements under the Environmental Protection Act for soil that is moved during construction activities to another site for a beneficial reuse.

Township consultants to provide comments.

#### Year of the Garden:

Council received a delegation presenting the Year of the Garden 2022 celebrations and inviting Council to proclaim 2022 as the Year of the Garden in Puslinch in celebration of the ornamental horticulture sector's centennial year.

#### Municipal Insurance:

Council authorized the renewal of the municipal insurance coverage and services contract to Marsh Canada Limited for the 2022 year at the quoted cost of \$148K plus taxes.

#### **Howitt Memorial Cemetery:**

Council authorized the transfer of ownership of the Howitt cemetery from the Western Ontario Waterways Regional Council to the Township for nominal consideration and costs.

#### **Brock Road Crosswalk:**

Staff will continue to work with Wellington County to implement additional measures at the crosswalk requesting enhanced and ongoing enforcement by the OPP and MTO in Aberfoyle corridor and supports the County implementing this location as a community safety zone.

#### **Heritage Committee:**

Puslinch cemeteries were highlighted in a publication written by committee member.

Abandoned heritage properties report was received and review of property standards by-law.

## County budget approved

Wellington County Council has adopted its 2022 budget with a 2.0% increase to the County portion of property taxes to focus on core services.

#### **Highlights**

Significant investment in roads capital infrastructure and public works facilities over the next ten years.

To include a \$41.2 million investment in facility upgrades and updates to the Aberfoyle public works facilities throughout the forecast.

Continuation of Rural Broadband investment to complete the gigabyte fibre optic buildout. A municipal contribution of \$4.0 million over five years, which began in 2021 and will continue from 2022-2025.

Implementation of the Climate Change Mitigation Plan for the County of Wellington.

Land Ambulance service expansion that will add a new 12-hour shift to improve response times across Wellington County.

Affordable housing property acquisition for future development to assist with meeting community needs.

#### Vitamin D shines

Vitamin D is made naturally in the body when summer sunshine absorbs into skin. Because the sun is lower in the sky October through May, our stores of vitamin D deplete in winter months

A simple supplement can help keep levels healthy.

It takes about thirty to sixty minutes of unprotected sun exposure between the hours of 10am to 2pm in the months May to September to make 1000IU of vitamin D in your body.

Amounts vary based on quantity of skin exposed and colour of skin. Fair skinned people absorb much quicker than dark skinned people.

#### Why the "sunshine" vitamin is important

There are vitamin D receptors all over your body. Below are few reasons, and there is so much more to consider!

#### Vitamin D and Bones

Vitamin D3 helps your bones absorb calcium and phosphorous. This makes bones strong. When combined with K2, D3 and a mineral matrix like calcium and magnesium, the K2 helps get the minerals into the bones.

#### Vitamin D and the Gut

Vitamin D is responsible for pulling together the gap junctions, or spaces between the cells lining the gastrointestinal tract.

It helps heal and prevent leaky gut, inflammatory bowel disease and may even help reduce risk for colorectal cancer.

It also helps promote a healthy microbiome, especially those microbes that make the B vitamins.

#### Vitamin D and Immune

Vitamin D reduces severity of respiratory tract infections. Specifically, it tightens mucosal barriers which protects us from infection.

Research recently shows populations at highest risk of COVID are also at highest risk of vitamin D deficiency.

Patients with COVID-19 with low vitamin D have higher levels of inflammatory markers like D-dimer, interleukin-6, and C-reactive protein. Talk to your doctor if you are concerned.


#### How much Vitamin D do you need?

Vitamin D3 is a hormone. Hormones have a happy level - like Goldilocksnot too high, not too low. You want it just right.

I like to see levels around 120 nmol/L. Be careful when you look at numbers quoted on American literature because they use a different measurement of ng/mL.

If you get sick at all, you will consume your stores more rapidly. I dose according to the blood level, the health of the patient and the season.

# Morriston Bypass - priority or phased in project?

I live on the busiest and most congested two-lane highway in Ontario. This is Highway 6 South in Morriston. Over 25,000 vehicles per day have been forced through a reduced two lane roadway through our small village for decades now.

On March 30, 2016 the Ontario Provincial Government finally announced and promised to start constructing the Morriston Bypass in 2019.

Then the Conservative Government came into power and other projects became a priority like the highly controversial Bradford Bypass and Highway 413 projects.

These projects have serious opposition from environmental and other groups. Meanwhile the Morriston Bypass has been a project ready to go for "shovels in the ground" for many years and has resounding support on many levels.

One level is the Morriston Bypass Coalition. This Coalition consists of major cities, townships, counties, major industries and a letter was sent on May 11, 2020 to the Ministers of Economic Development and Finance urging that the Bypass start without delay.

Apparently "With respect to funding and schedule, provincial priorities can change over time and this project is currently being funded based on the phased approach."

Whatever that means.

It leaves many questions unanswered, like why was the Bypass project downgraded? When will government funding be put in place to complete all phases? What are the schedule and timelines for all the phases?

Letters have been sent to local politicians, and meanwhile Morriston awaits the answers.


## Township budget approved

The Council of the Township of Puslinch approved its 2022 Operating and Capital Budget with a 3.83% tax increase.

For the typical Puslinch residence assessed at \$604,700, the increase represents a \$40 annual increase for the Township portion of the property tax bill.

The increase per \$100,000 of residential assessment value is approximately \$7 annually for the Township portion of the property tax bill.

Taking into account the County of Wellington's 2022 Budget and the 2022 Education Tax Rate, the blended tax impact for the typical Puslinch residence assessed at \$604,700 is 2.03% or \$116 annually. The blended tax increase per \$100,000 of residential assessment value is approximately \$19 annually.



#### 2022 Budget Highlights

Increase in operating costs due to enhanced service levels related to the addition of a full-time by- law enforcement officer, addition of a full-time equipment operator, and addition of a part- time crossing quard.

Increase in operating costs due to increases in the Ontario Minimum Wage, 2022 Municipal Election, and insurance premium costs.

Contributions of \$1,725,750 into Discretionary Reserves for future projects and equipment including contributions of \$207,800 for future gravel road improvements.

Over \$1,879,430 invested in roads, bridges culverts, and storm water management facilities to maintain a safe and efficient transportation network across the Township.

Improvements to Leslie Road West, Kerr Crescent Stormwater Management Facility, Carriage Lane Stormwater Management Facility, Gilmour Culvert, Little's Bridge, Concession 1 Culvert, and Concession 7 paving.

Enhancements to Township parks and facilities: Puslinch Community Centre Park Renovation and Upgrade, Replacement of Morriston Meadows Bleachers, LED lighting upgrades at Township facilities, and Municipal Office upgrades.

















#### **Puslinch Junior Garden Club** celebrates 40 years

peppers, carrots, beets, onions and flowers.

Gardens are inspected in July and August and points are assigned for progress and success, and they learn how to present their vegetables and flowers for judging at the Fall Fair.

In 2008 Maryann added making a scarecrow to the program and the kids have fun making some very creative and unique scarecrows.

"This year", Maryann says, "we plan to wrap up the season with a

banquet to celebrate members' gardening achievements, and to recognize the founding leaders and others who volunteered a great deal of time over the past 40 years to teaching Puslinch children a valuable life-skill for a life-time."

Gardening is exercise! It uses every muscle group, and research has shown that it relieves stress and promotes a positive state of mind.

It is an activity you can use anywhere, anytime, and at almost any age. If you don't have a plot you can grow almost anything in a pot!

Maryann said some of her "senior" gardeners were unable to complete their last year due to pandemic restrictions.

She wants you to know that you are very welcome to return this year and complete the program.



In honour of the third month of the year, head out for a 3km hike. Walk around your own neighbourhood or try out a new trail. Tune into your surroundings and explore.




#### Notice re: Tennis in Puslinch

This winter we will be replacing all of the florescent light fixtures with LED panels. No ballasts or bulb changes means less waste and they only use about one-third of the energy of the old lights.




**Dove House at Crieff Hills**

#### Cook's Corner

#### By Barbara Patterson

A tasty soup for a blustery March day. When served cold, it becomes the classic Vichyssoise which is wonderful on a hot summer day.



#### Potato & Leek Soup

1 tbsp. olive oil

- 3 large leeks, trimmed and chopped\*
- 1 clove garlic, finely chopped
- 3 large potatoes, peeled and diced
- 1 carton (900 ml) sodium-reduced chicken stock
- 1½ 2 cups evaporated milk (Carnation)
- 1 tsp. chopped fresh thyme, or pinch of dried

½ tsp. pepper Salt to taste Extra old cheddar cheese for garnish

- 1. Heat oil in large saucepan. Add leeks and garlic. Cook gently for 5 - 7 minutes. Add diced potatoes and mix well.
- Add stock and bring to boil. Add thyme, pepper and salt. Reduce heat and simmer gently for 20 minutes, or until the potatoes are tender.
- 3. Puree soup with hand-held blender or put in food processor or blender.
- Return to burner and heat thor-Serve garnished with cheddar cheese or green onions.

Note: \* 3 medium yellow onions can be substituted. I did, with good re-

When served cold, garnish with chives or green onions.

To accompany the soup try this very simple recipe for biscuits. If you use self-raising flour (which the original recipe called for), you only have three ingredients because self-raising flour contains baking powder and salt.

#### **Tea Biscuits**



2 cups all-purpose flour 4 tsp. baking powder ½ tsp. salt 3 heaping tablespoons mayonnaise 1 cup milk

- Mix together flour, baking powder and salt.
- 2. Add mayonnaise and milk. Mix well.
- 3. Knead until the dough is elasticlike. Add a little more flour if the dough is too sticky to handle.
- 4. Form into 12 balls and put in a greased muffin tin.
- Bake at 350°F for approximately 18 minutes.



# In search of the ancients – the Black Oaks of Vineland

Our trekking brought us to Vineland to the oldest Mennonite church in Canada. In 1786, after the American revolution, Mennonites immigrated from Pennsylvania to Ontario due to concerns over religious freedom.

As pacifists, they were afraid of religious persecution or being conscripted into the US colonial militia.

Also, there was dwindling good farm land in Pennsylvania but vast amounts in Ontario.

The main west migration trail had a stop over point near Twenty Mile creek. One of the immigrating families had lost a child on their journey to Ontario and buried the child at this resting point.

This point was the beginnings of the Vineland Mennonite church and the one-acre burial area.

And it is this historic cemetery associated with the Mennonite Church that we searched.

Throughout this old cemetery are 200 + year old black oaks. They tower over the gravesites of the early colonists to the Twenty Mile creek area.

Of interest are the black oaks shading the Rittenhouse family plot.

Moses Rittenhouse (1846 – 1915) was born in Vineland but moved to Chicago in 1864 to make his fortunes in lumber. But he never forgot his roots and donated monies back to his community.

He is famous throughout the Niagara region for being a co founder of the Vineland Research station. He donated the land for the research station that is renowned for its research on tender fruit production.
